#### **DEI Keyword of the Month: -isms: Racism**

This is month 1 of our series on "-isms", and we wanted to explore one of the most commonly discussed "-ism": **racism**. For such a common term, the definition is not always clear cut, but we like the definition provided by Ijeoma Oluo in her book *So You Want to Talk About Race*: "a prejudice against someone based on race, when those prejudices are reinforced by systems of power" (p.27). #### Plan ahead for a year of DEI-focused teaching and learning!

Last year, we started the DEI newsletter for two main reasons: (1) to give staff resources to start or continue the work of anti-racism, diversity, equity, and inclusion in their schools and (2) to highlight DEI work that is already being done at different sites across the consortium and facilitate cross-program learning. ### <u>Article of the Month - Teaching about Hispanic Identity</u>

Anti-racist Education Article of the month: Most people don't know that Mexican Independence day is NOT the 5th of May (also known as Cinco de Mayo), but in fact September 16th, 1810 was when Mexican independence day is commemorated (more than 50 years prior to the Battle of Puebla, on May 5, 1862). One of the ways in which you can be anti-racist is to learn about which holidays you are celebrating and what the meaning is behind it. You will then be able to share this knowledge with the students you work with and help them make an informed decision about whether something is culturally appropriate.
