February 19: Meatfare Sunday, observed by Orthodox Christians **February 19-21:** Losar, the Tibetan Buddhist New Year.

February 20: Presidents' Day **February 21:** Mardi Gras or Shrove Tuesday, a celebration in some Christian denominations.

February 22: Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent on the Christian calendar.

February 25–March 1: Intercalary Days or Ayyám-i-Há, celebrated by people of the Bahá'í faith.

February 26: Cheesefare Sunday or Forgiveness Sunday, the day before Great Lent for Orthodox Christians

February 27: Beginning of Great Lent in the Orthodox Christian faith.

February 28: Rare Disease Day

DEI Keyword of the Month: Colorism

<u>Colorism</u>: prejudice or discrimination against individuals with a dark skin tone, typically among people of the same ethnic or racial group.

King and Johnson (2016) published a study in The American Journal of Sociology entitled <u>"A"</u>
Punishing Look: Skin Tone and Afrocentric
Features in the Halls of Justice" that "indicate[s] that darker skin tone and Afrocentric facial features are associated with harsher sanctions" in criminal punishments such as sentencing.
