May 1: Beltane, an ancient Celtic festival celebrated on May Day, signifying the beginning of summer

May 3: Feasts of Saints Philip and James, a Roman rite feast dav.

May 4: National Day of Prayer, observed in the United States, where people are asked to "turn to God in prayer and meditation".

May 5: Cinco de Mayo, celebrating the Mexican Army's 1862 victory over France at the Battle of Puebla during the Franco-Mexican War. May 8–9 (sundown to sundown): Lag BaOmer, a Jewish holiday marking the day of hillula of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai

May 17: International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia, and Biphobia, a global celebration of sexual orientation and gender diversities

May 18: Ascension of Jesus or Ascension Day, celebrated within some of the Christian faith May 19: Malcolm X Day, to commemorate the civil rights leader May 21: World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development, a day set aside by the of Bahá'u'lláh, the founder of the United Nations

May 23-24 (sundown to sundown): Declaration of the Báb, the forerunner of Bahá'u'lláh. the founder of the Bahá'í faith. May 26: Buddha Day (Vesak or Visakha Puja), a Buddhist festival that marks Gautama Buddha's birth, enlightenment, and death. May 26-27 (sundown to sundown): Shavuot, a Jewish holiday that marks the wheat harvest in Israel and the anniversary of the Jews receiving the Torah at Mount Sinai. May 28: Pentecost, the Christian celebration of the giving of the Ten Commandments

May 29: Memorial Day in the United States, honoring military veterans who died in wars fought by US forces

May 29: Ascension of Bahá'u'lláh, commemorates the ascension Bahá'í faith

DEI Keyword of the Month: Bamboo Ceiling

Bamboo Ceiling:

The term "**bamboo ceiling**" was coined and popularized in 2005 by Jane Hyun in <u>Breaking the Bamboo Ceiling: Career</u> <u>Strategies for Asians</u>, where she addresses the barriers faced by many <u>Asian Americans</u> in the professional arena, such as stereotypes and racism, while also providing solutions to overcome these barriers.^{[1][2]} The bamboo ceiling, as defined by Jane Hyun, is a combination of individual, cultural, and organizational factors that impede Asian Americans' career progress inside organizations. *-Wikipedia*
